¹ In Siauliai Rayon a non-partisan candidate, supported by the coalition named “Here is Our Home” (NU, LU, Women, Peasant, “Young Lithuania”) won. However, he lost the mayoral post before long since the Conservative opposition rolled back. In Telsiai Rayon the Conservatives split and a Conservative minority candidate supported by Centrist and Left parties won. But he was almost immediately outcast from the post, and a Conservative majority candidate became the mayor.
