Russia's long-standing exploitation of its Arctic areas has raised concerns about the future of the fragile northern environment and the severe situation of Indigenous peoples living in the area. These themes are central to local literature that often explores human–non-human relationships and their intertwinement with colonial discourses and tropes of modernization. The lecture focuses on these questions in the literature of northern Uralic peoples such as the Sámi, the Nenets, and the Khanty, written in late 20th and early 21st century.
